TRANSNATIONAL PROJECT MEETING

at Yusufça School, Turkey from October 4th to October 10th 2015.

This transnational meeting took place at the same time as the short-term exchange of pupils at Yusufça School, Turkey from October 4th to October 10th 2015.

The subjects discussed by the people mentioned above during this transnational meeting are mentioned below :

We talked about the activities that were left to do before the end of **Part 2 : Houses of the Past**. It was mainly **Activity N° 3** (already mentioned during the transnational meeting in England in April 2015) :

Each school will organise a visit to an old place (of Celtic origin, of Roman origin, of medieval origin...etc) to work on the houses of the time and a film will be made from this visit and the activities done in that place or about that place.

This activity is to be published on the blog before Christmas 2015.

We didn't really mentioned **Activity N°4** which was **optional** and for which no date was given because we all realized that we didn't have much time to do it.

[**Activity N°4 :(Optional)** The pupils in groups will choose a different region from their own (but in their country) which is famous with its typical traditional houses and make a model or a computer model of the houses. SketchUp can be used. Silvia will give help if it is needed.]

We judged **the Newspaper Article Competition** (Maria José having sent us her students' works and her votes in advance by mail). The winner was **Horror at the Hall** by English students.

We agreed that before Christmas 2015, we should do the **selections for the visit to Greece**, to organize our flights in the best way (cheap costs, stop in Athens where we could meet other partners...) and also to tell Christina the information (gender, age...) about the ambassadors selected so that she can find host families in Greece. It was said that England would take 10 students + 2 teachers, Turkey would take 10 or 12 students + 2 teachers, France would take 10 students + 2 teachers and we would inform Maria José from Spain so that she tells us how many students/teachers she would take.

Then, we talked about the visit to Greece and the activities that would be done during **Part 3 : Houses of famous people**. Christina had prepared a programme for the visit to Greece (that will certainly be modified a little but that gave us an idea of what we would do there) A copy of this programme was given to each participant and one was sent to Maria José. Christina had also prepared and detailed the two activities that were mentioned on the application form. That is to say:

Part 3, Activity 1, Famous people of my town (who lived or have their origins in my town): students in each country will visit the library or the local archives centre to know more about the important people who

lived in the area.

For example in Greece : A visit to the *Municipal Center for Historical Research and Documentation of Volos*.

The pupils will be informed by the librarians for the rich archive and they will be directed to the most interested historical archives about famous people's houses in their town.

It is an opportunity for the students to learn how to collect data in order to organize their research (look up in a real library/archive and in a digital library)


Subjects : history, social studies methodology, ICT

Part 3, Activity 2, which will also be the **competition** for Part 3, create a **touristic leaflet for a famous person's house** : students will study the biography of a famous person and they will choose a house of their town/area that is related to that famous person. They will study the house from different aspects (architecture, history...etc) and then they will create a leaflet for the touristic promotion of the house they have chosen. The leaflet has to be attractive to help the house become a touristic destination for their town.

Subjects : history, fine arts, cultural studies, literature, marketing, economy, tourism, ICT

It was agreed that if a touristic leaflet already existed, the students could imagine another one aiming at another audience/public (like children for instance...).

The leaflet would be a 3 piece leaflet/brochure made using a computer, with text and photos.



Each partner will bring the 5 best leaflets of their schools to Greece in April so that we can choose the best one. A reward will then be given.

Referring to the remarks made by the French Erasmus+ agency regarding the report that I had done in April 2015 about the first part of the project, I mentioned the fact we should think of an activity to be done by international teams, that is to say teams composed of students in at least two countries (or more) of the project. To do that, the students would have to find a famous person connected with at least two countries of the project and who would have lived in the two countries. The students in both countries would look up for information about where the famous person lived in their country, how they lived and describe their house and put all their data together.



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For instance, a **French and Spanish team** could work on the French writer **George Sand** who lived in France (in Paris and in Nohant near Ecueillé) and who went to Spain (to the Balearic islands). An **English and Turkish team** could work on **Agatha Christie** who lived in England but who also spent some time in Istanbul. (Agatha Christie studied in Paris and went to Athens, so we could also imagine a bigger team here!)



A **Greek and Turkish team** could work on **Atatürk** who was born in Greece before being the President of Turkey.

The idea behind this activity is that students from different countries exchange information, write things together thanks to Facebook (Burak, the English teacher at Yusufça, said that he could prepare a special page on Facebook for the students to work together and exchange information) or Skype or any other digital means. The final product from this work wasn't chosen and could be left to the students' choice: it could be something visual, like a glogster, a poster on the web (<https://www.glogster.com/#one>)...or something else.

We also proposed dates for **the visit to Spain, from October 13th to October 20th 2016** and for **the visit to France, from March 31st to April 9th 2017**.
