We studied for one week in School Correia Matteus in Leiria (Portugal) with five hundred students (thirty kindergarten students in only one class who study three years from 3 to 6, four primary classes with a total of eighty students and three hundred and ninety students in secondary school).

In the morning we (the English, French and Portuguese) went to a physics lesson, it was interesting to attend a familiar class in another language. After that we participated to a physical education class and since no activity was planned, we could play football, table tennis and other games ... The sports grounds are divided into two basketball courts (two goals and four baskets on every pitch).

Their school is substantially similar to ours, there is a canteen and classrooms on two floors (there is even a vending machine selling beverages and cakes ...)

At 7 p.m, we had to go to the school party, along with the English group which was also invited. There was a large buffet with several sweet and savoury specialities brought by the parents also invited to this evening. We could see several musical performances by Portuguese students (there is a music academy in their school). There were all kinds of instruments (violins, acoustic guitars, saxophone, tuba, piano ...) We even heard solo performances by some students. It was beautiful to listen to them and to be given the opportunity to see their musical technique. To end the evening each international group sang one or more songs dear to their

hearts.

Obidos

On Thursday, April 21st in the morning, we went to Obidos Castle with our Portuguese and English friends. Obidos is a village that was built in the Middle Ages in 1148 and fortified in 1527.

The village is surrounded with walls and towered by a fortified castle.

Four doors and two porticos give access to the town. The fortified castle strengthen the wall on the north side.













Obidos is about one hour's drive from Leiria and is situated quite near the capital city, on a high place.
