


The Clock Tower

It indicates the time to Londoners. The melody of its bells is world-famous.

People usually call this tower "Big Ben" but it is in fact the name of the bell inside.

BIG BEN

Big Ben first rang in 1859.



The Clock Tower is 98.5 metres high

The hour hand is 2.7 metres (9 ft) long and the minute hand is 4.3 metres (14 ft) long



Big Ben is the most popular clock in the world. It weighs thirteen tons.

Origin of the name: A certain Sir Benjamin Hall was responsible for hanging* (accrocher) the bell. He was a very big man and people called him: "Big Benjamin". So he gave his name to the bell.

The Houses of Parliament

Its real name is "Westminster Palace". It was rebuilt in the nineteenth century.

It is the meeting place of the House of Lords and the House of Commons.

It was inaugurated on December 31st, 1999 and opened on March 2000.

It cost £70,000,000.

It carries around 10,000 visitors everyday. Over 3,500,000 people see London from the London Eye every year.

London Eye is the world's tallest observation Ferris wheel: 135 metres tall.
