

sandwich a 6-inch square of batting between and pin together.

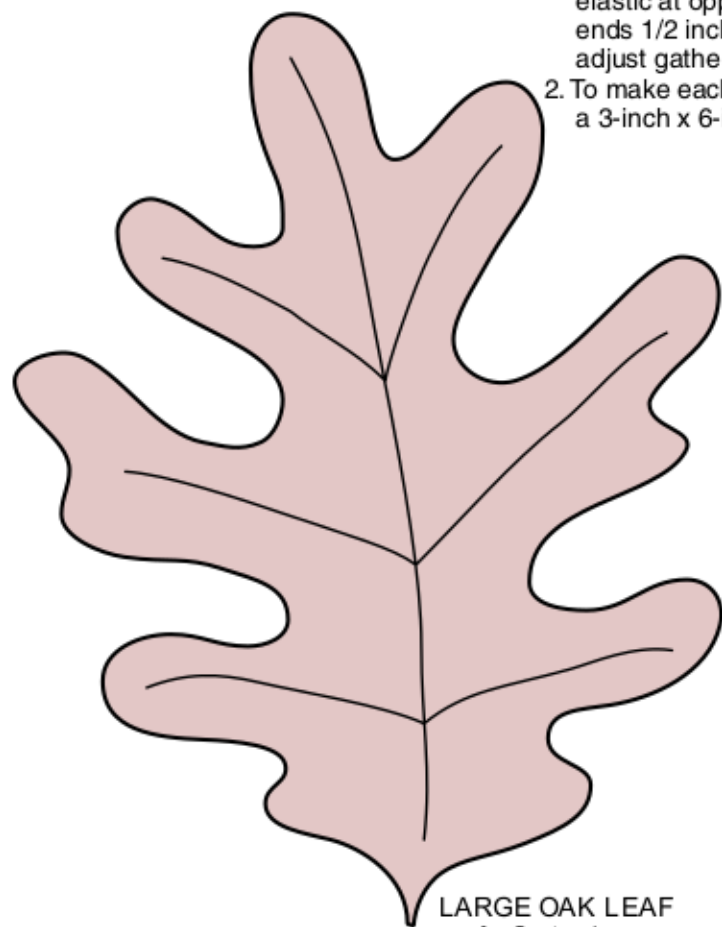
2. Using chalk or disappearing pen, draw outlines and all vein lines of the large maple leaf. Satin stitch outlines. Straight stitch vein lines. Cut out just outside the outline stitching.
3. Apply seam sealant to outside edges; dry on waxed paper.

Napkin Ring

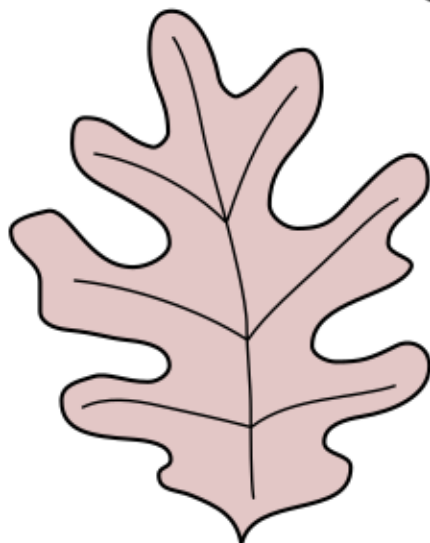
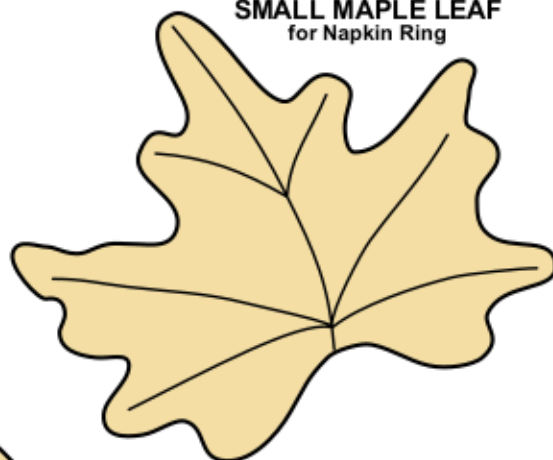
1. For each napkin ring, fold one 2 1/2-inch x 9-inch fabric strip in half lengthwise with right sides together. Stitch a 1/4-inch seam across long edge. Turn right side out to form a tube. Use bodkin to insert elastic through tube and stitch in place at one end; pull through and stitch elastic at opposite end. Overlap ends 1/2 inch and zigzag in place; adjust gathered fabric over elastic.
2. To make each of the two leaves, fold a 3-inch x 6-inch rectangle wrong

sides together to form a 3-inch square, sandwich a 3-inch square of fusible web between and fuse to one half; remove paper backing and fuse to the other half.

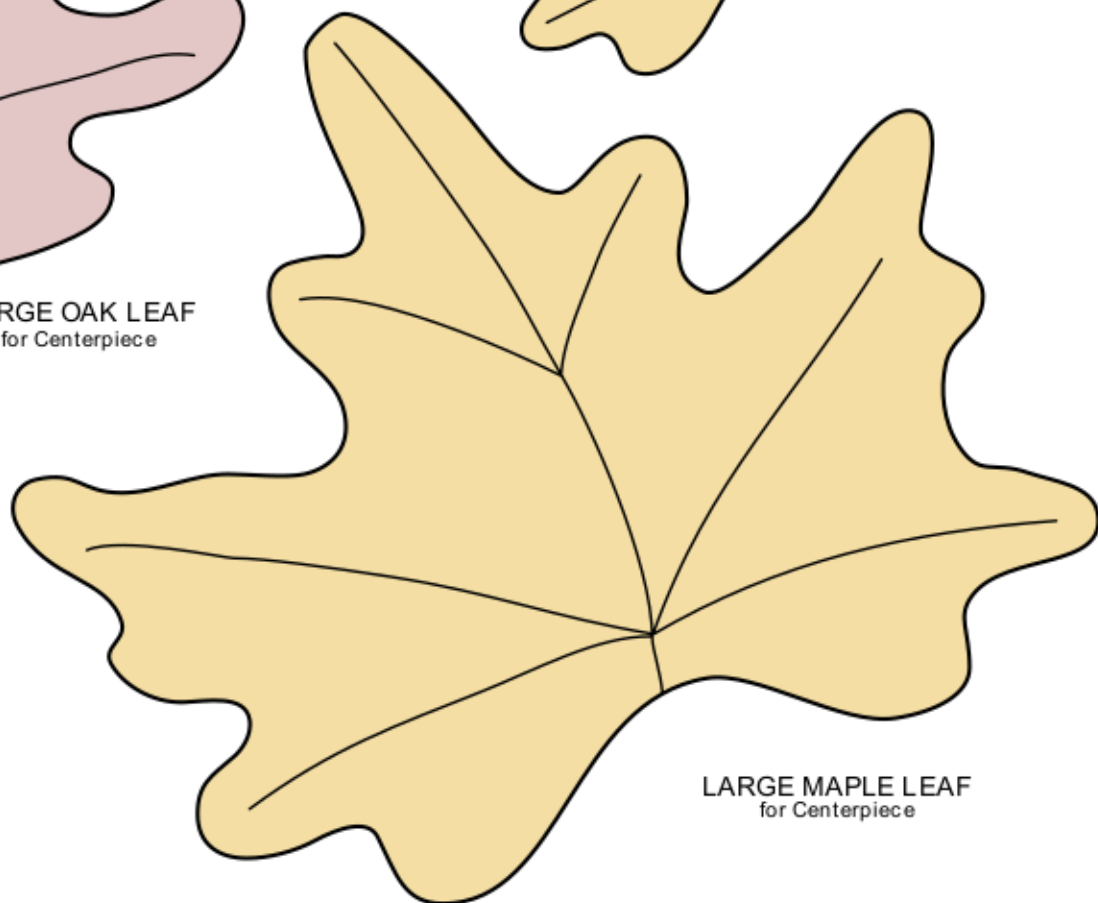
3. Trace outline of small maple leaf on one square and small oak leaf on the other; cut out.
4. Draw veins on both leaves with brown fabric marker; press.
5. Position and glue two leaves over joined edges of napkin ring.
