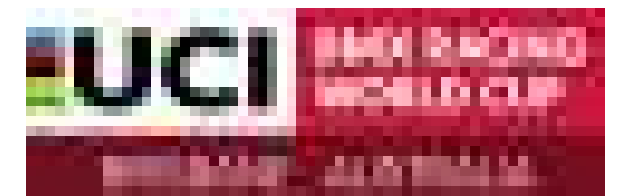

The newly upgraded track incorporating the latest technical design and construction trends, will play host to the 2026 UCI BMX Racing World Championships and BMX Racing as part of the Olympic Games in 2032.

REGISTRATION & RULES

REGISTRATION & RULES

All riders must enter through their National Federation or by the UCI BMX Racing Team registered with the UCI of which they are a member; no individual entries will be accepted.

The 2024 UCI BMX Racing World Cup offers entry into the combined Under 23 category for Junior and Under 23 riders, or the Elite category for riders aged 19 or over. Registration deadlines are indicated in the General Race Parameters available on the UCI website (www.uci.org) under UCI BMX Racing World Cup official documents.

Registration is via the UCI Reg-Online system, using the following link; [Sign In \(uci.ch\)](#).

The name and address of the hotel where the riders will stay must be given during the online registration.

The name and contact details (email and WhatsApp number) for each Team Manager must be provided during the online registration.

Where currency is exchanged, the rate used is set out in the UCI financial obligations for BMX Racing, which is located on the [UCI website](#).

Entry payments

The entry fee for the 2024 UCI BMX Racing World Cup is €150 for the Under 23 category and €250 for the Elite category when using the online registration system. After the registration deadline the National Federation will receive an invoice by e-mail, sent by AusCycling (note invoice will be in the equivalent AUD). The invoice should be paid by bank transfer before the event

The entry fee must be paid for all entries not withdrawn before the online registration deadline, whether the rider(s) concerned are confirmed or not. For more information regarding payment of invoices please contact bmxworldcup@auscycling.org.au

Late registrations

Late registrations are entries handled after the online registration deadline and before the riders' confirmation deadline.

Late registration is only possible through the National Federation or UCI BMX Racing Team and until the end of riders' confirmation on site which is on Thursday 22 February between 18.00 - 20.00. The entry fee for late registration is €300 for Under 23 and €500 for elite and must be paid immediately on site.

Rider confirmation

Riders confirmation is on Thursday 22 February between 18.00 - 20.00 at Anna Meares Velodrome (next to the BMX Track).

All Team Managers must attend the riders' confirmation, presenting the riders licences and picking up their race numbers. Riders not being confirmed before the indicated deadline above did not complete the registration procedure and will not be able to compete at the event. Riders that were registered through the online system but that are unable to participate will still need to pay their entry fee to the organiser. The registration office is located in the Anna Meares Velodrome.

Team staff accreditation

All rainbow passes are delivered to the teams during the first event of the year. If additional sporting passes are necessary, the request needs to be sent before the event to norm.mccann@uci.ch. For the request, please indicate the reason, the name and the contact details of the person for whom the sporting passes are requested. Passes will be distributed during riders' confirmation in the registration room.

Riders access

All riders and support staff are provided with an accreditation pass at riders confirmation, so they can access the premises during practice and competition periods. The pass provides access to the team and rider area.

Before riders confirmation, for training sessions and equipment drop off etc you should check in direct to the office at the BMX track, to obtain a training wristband. See below.

Team Bibs

Team Bibs will be provided for National Teams and UCI BMX Racing Teams during the rider confirmation.

Teams will be asked to pay a **\$100** deposit per bib.

The Team Bib gives access to allocated places explained by the PCP during the Team Managers meeting. The bibs need to be returned to the UCI Race Secretary at latest by the end of racing on Sunday 25 February. Upon return of the bib the deposit will be refunded at that time.

Team areas

The team area is situated adjacent to the start hill. The team area is not accessible for cars. During identified 'team bump-in' times vehicles can be 'short-term' parked nearby to team area for equipment drop off and unload.

Parking

Parking for teams is possible in the team parking area, near to the team area. This parking will be clearly indicated. Display your parking pass in the front window. Parking passes will be available at rider confirmation

Team managers meeting

The Team Managers meeting will be held at 17.00 on Thursday, 22 February at the Anna Meares Velodrome next to the BMX track.

Brisbane SX BMX track

Team area tents

All teams can have a 3 x 3 metre tent at their disposal in the team area. A table, chairs and powerpoint are included.

A tent in the team area can be rented by teams for **\$800 (excl. GST and transaction costs)**. It is possible to rent more than one tent; they will be connected to create one large space.

PLEASE NOTE: At the Team Area, located close to the start hill, there is room for 50 team tents. If the number of reservation exceeds 50, we will place the other tents at a secondary location. Spaces will be allocated on a first come, first serve base. Please note that bookings cannot be cancelled.

Team Areas will be accessible from Friday 23 February 09.00 to Sunday 25 February 19.00.

The bump-in of team equipment can only be on Thursday (22nd) from 09:00 to 11:00 and Friday (23rd) morning from 07:30 to 09:30.

Bump-out of team equipment takes place on Sunday (25th) from 18:00. Every tent must be cleared out by teams before 19:30.

Rider & Team Manager Seating

The team managers and riders have access to all general spectator areas within the facility, wearing their accreditation pass, but not the reserved seating grandstand. There is also be a small standing area for Team Managers trackside on the start straight.

Water

Teams are responsible for their own water, ice etc. The tap water in Brisbane is safe to drink. Otherwise bottled water can be bought at all supermarkets across Brisbane.

Food

Lunches, as well as general snacks, food and beverage is available on site at the kiosk in Anna Meares Velodrome at the top of the stairs and at the Sleemans Swimming Pool. Food vans will also be present in the spectator village.

Awards/trophies

The trophies will be awarded to the first three riders of each category at the awards ceremony.

Prize Money

AusCycling will pay equal prize money in accordance with UCI's BMX Racing World Cup prize-money policy and according to the table.

Prize money will be paid in \$AUD via bank-account wire transfer. Riders that are due prize-money will be required to provide their bank account details to AusCycling. Details are to be provided at the Organisers office at the end of the competition. Bank details must be provided by the end of February 2024 to ensure payment of prize-money.

ENTRY INTO AUSTRALIA

ENTRY INTO AUSTRALIA

When planning your logistics for travel to Australia it is very important to be well organised, ahead of time.

AusCycling liaises with the Australian government's Visa office, who have provided the following information to assist you.

Visa Application Process and Processing Times

Visa applications are assessed on a case-by-case basis, and actual processing times can vary due to individual circumstances including:

- whether the applicant has lodged a complete application, including all necessary supporting documents and paid associated visa application charges
- how promptly the applicant responds to any requests for additional information
- how long it takes to perform required checks on the supporting information provided
- how long it takes to receive information from external agencies, particularly in relation to health, character, and national security requirements
- when the application is lodged taking the current global visa processing times into account

Processing times are impacted each month by cases that are complex, changes to volume of applications and changes to Ministerial Directions. More information about visa processing times please see: <https://immi.homeaffairs.gov.au/visas/getting-a-visa/visa-processing-times/overview>.

For this reason, we would advise that visa applications be lodged at least 4 to 6 weeks prior to a person's intended date of travel.

VISA letter of invitation

Should your visa application require a letter of invitation to the event then you can obtain one by emailing the organising team: bmxxworldcup@auscycling.org.au. For each rider and/or team member you must include details of full name (according to passport), nation, date of birth, gender, role, passport number, arrival date and departure date, in order for us to be able to issue you with an appropriate letter supporting your application.

ENTRY INTO AUSTRALIA

Visa Types (Amateurs and Volunteers)

For visa purposes, athletes, coaches, judges, officials and support people are considered to be amateur if they:

- are competing, training or participating without remuneration (or not receiving prize money that is equivalent to a salary or income); and/or
- does not derive an income from their activity or where the activity is not the person's usual occupation

An amateur sports person or team participating in an amateur sporting event or series of events may be eligible to apply for the following visa options:

- **Visitor (subclass 600) Tourist stream visa.** For more information see: <https://immi.homeaffairs.gov.au/visas/getting-a-visa/visa-listing/visitor-600/tourist-stream-overseas>
- **Electronic Travel Authority – ETA (subclass 601).** For eligible passport holders and more information see: <https://immi.homeaffairs.gov.au/visas/getting-a-visa/visa-listing/electronic-travel-authority-601>
- **eVisitor (subclass 651) Tourist Stream) visa.** For eligible passport holders and more information see: <https://immi.homeaffairs.gov.au/visas/getting-a-visa/visa-listing/evisitor-651>

Please note: Visa applicants claiming to be an amateur athlete or competitor will be required to provide evidence or supporting documents with their visa application. This may include evidence of their primary source of employment or income, such as a letter from their employer stating their occupation, how long they have been employed, and that they have been given a leave of absence. Students may provide a letter from their educational institution or provider.

Support persons, including a coach, manager, medical professional, official, or referee, **who are supporting an amateur sports person or team on a genuine unpaid volunteer basis** may be eligible for the following visa options:

Visa Types (Professionals)

Participation at an event by a coach, manager, medical professional, official, or referee, **where the activity is the person's usual occupation** may be eligible to apply for the following visa options:

ENTRY INTO AUSTRALIA

Visa Types (Media)

Journalists or other media personnel travelling to Australia to cover an event, at the invitation of an Australian organisation, **and where the production or broadcast is intended for Australian audiences** may be eligible to apply for a:

Journalists or other media personnel travelling to Australia to cover an event, where the production/broadcast is not intended for Australian audiences may be eligible to apply for a:

Biometrics

Visa applicants outside of Australia will need to provide biometrics when they apply for a visa that is part of the Australian biometrics program, or where they are from a country, or located in a country at time of application that is part of the Australian biometrics program.

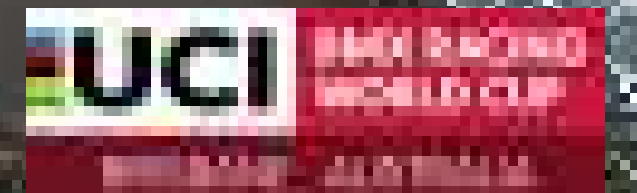
