CURACAÛ, PORT-AU-PRINCE, NASSAU and return to NEW YORK

ABSTRACT OF LOG

Left AMBROSE L. V., 10:18 P. M., Feb. 15th, 1963. - Arrived RIO DE JANEIRO, 7.30 A. M., February 25th, 1963.
Temperature 21° F. Distance 5007 Nautical miles, via Dominica February 18th and Fort-de-France February 19th
Passing Equator, February 22nd at GMT 15:14 by 37° longitude West.
Steaming Time : 8 days, 8 hours, 0 minute. Average Speed 25, 03 Knots.
North gale during the first day. Thence light easterly breeze. Fine weather.

Left RIO DE JANEIRO, 7:24 P. M., February 27th. Docked Curacao, 6:30 A. M. March 7th, 1963.
Temperature 81° F. Distance 3714 Nautical miles via Barbados March 5th.
Steaming Time : 6 days, 18 hours, 12 minutes, Average Speed 22, 90 Knots.
Trade Easterly winds. Force 4 to 5 - Light Swell. Scattered showers and fair weather.

Left CURACAÛ, 2:18 A. M., March 8th. Arrived New York - Ambrose L. V. 5:00 A. M. March 13th, 1963.
Temperature 79° F. Distance 2222 Nautical Miles via Port-au-Prince, March 9th and Nassau, March 11th.
Steaming Time : 3 days, 15 hours, 0 minute. Average Speed 25, 54 Knots
Northeast winds. Clear Sky. Sea moderate. Fresh breeze in the North.

From NEW YORK to NEW YORK
10, 943 Nautical miles or 12, 601 Statute miles.
Average Speed 24, 36 Knots or 28, 05 miles per hour.
