Colorize

Flowermouse Design - Lone Arnsted

Add some color to your outfit, to your soul and to life. This is a simple way to have fun knitting and to colorize everyday life.



Knitting in color is essential to me. As all chlothing turns gray and black during autumn and winter, colors lift my spirit and make me look better.

Knitting should be fun and colorful. Colorize is an asymetric scarf with knitted rings. Find your colorful yarn and Colorize a little bit of the world.



About the scarf

Colorize is knitted in stockinette stitch. You can use up some stash yarn or get yourself some favorite skeins. The sides will curl as a part of the design.

You knit four alternating rows in the first part of the scarf. Second you use one complementary color and last you knit stripes and rings to attach to the end. Colorize is an asymetric scarf.

I knitted Colorize in fingering weight. But any weight will do. Be aware that yarn choise will have effect on the size.

Measure

My scarf measures 254 x 61cm after washing and lying flat to dry.

Materials

For Colorize I used Rauma Finull:

Color A: 3 skeins Rauma Finull, pink color 4686 Color B: 3 skeins Rauma Finull, red color 418 Color C: 3 skeins Rauma Finull, green color 454

Tapestry needle for weaving in ends

Needles

3mm circular needle in 60cm length, or needle to go with your yarn choice. Double point needles 3mm

Gauge

Not important for this project. But notice that your yarn choise will effect on the size.

Abbreviations

CO: Cast on K: Knit P: Purl

yo: yarn over

K1 tbl: Knit one stitch through back loop

ssk: slip 1st knitwise, slip next st knitwise, replace on left hand needle and k2tog

through back loops

BO: Bind off

Instructions

Note: You will change color on one side of the scarf, and increase/decrease on the other side of the scarf. This makes the edges better looking.

Cast on 30st with color A

Row 1: Purl

Row 2: Knit

Row 3: Purl

Row 4: Knit

Row 5: Attach color B, purl

Row 6: Knit

Row 7: Purl Row 8: Knit



Repeat rows 5-8 alternating 4 rows between color A and B until your work is 10cm long, ending with row 8.

Start increasing on every 4th row, and continue alternating color A and B:

Row 1: Purl Row 2: Knit

Row 3: Purl until last stitch, yo, P1 Row 4: K1, K1 tbl, knit to end of row

Repeat rows 1-4 until you have 154 stitches on your needle ending with row 4.

Change to color C and start decreasing like this:

Row 1: Purl

Row 2: K1, ssk, knit to end of row

Repeat rows 1-2 until you have 23 stitches on your needle.

Note: Start decreasing on every 4th row while you start knitting two rows of each color, A, B and C starting with a purl row. Knit in red, pink and green for the stripes. Carry the yarn you do not use up along the side. Continue until you have 3st on your needle. Knit 2rows of each color one more time, and end knitting 3 rows with your last color. Bind off and leave a long enough tail to sew with.

Knit rings

Please read instructions before start knitting.


Use your dpns for knitting the rings.

Ring 1

CO 40st, join to knit in the round. Knit 10 rows, BO. Weave in ends.

Ring 2

CO 30st, add ring 1 to your needles (see fig 1) and join for knitting in the round. Let ring 1 follow your knitting (see fig 2). Knit 10 rows, BO. Weave in ends.



Ring 3

CO 24st, add ring 2 to your needles (see fig 1) and join for knitting in the round. Let ring 2 follow your knitting (see fig 2). Knit 10 rows, BO. Weave in ends.

Attach ring 3 to your scarf: Take the end of Colorize trough ring 3 and sew it to the scarf using the tail you left after BO. Weave in end.



Wear your Colorize with pride - and never ever let anyone tell you that colors are only for children.
