

- 1943 Conor F, an Irishman, gets sober in Philadelphia
- 1946 Conor F visits Ireland on holiday, resolves to create a group in Ireland before leaving
- 1946 Nov 18<sup>th</sup> First Meeting in Ireland. First sober member **Richard P.**

Sackville gets sober ("The Career Officer" story Third Edition Big Book)

(Ireland operated together with England, Scotland and Wales until forming their own General Service Board in 1968.

Ireland is 'All Ireland' – Northern Ireland and Eire)

# England



- 1945 **Bob B** gets sober in New York, 'Canadian Bob'. UK residents start to contact GSO in New York
- 1946 Readers Digest publish an article on AA. Creates world-wide interest

American A.A.s in London may have held some meetings **Dorothy H-E** listed as contact, later replaced by:

**Chris B**, a Londoner, previously sobered up in America after meeting Albert T, a friend of Bill W.

Probably the first Englishman to sober up the 'A.A. Way'

**Norman R-W**, an English alcoholic writes to New York after seeing 'The Lost Weekend'— he doesn't manage to stop.

# First Meeting in England

31st March1947 in **Grace O**'s room in the Dorchester. (Room 202)

Also Present – Canadian Bob, Chris B, Sergeant Vernon W – an American serviceman and a founder of A.A. in Bermuda, Norman R-W, Tony F, an Irish airman, Flash W, an American and Pat G, a female member from California whom Grace had met on the voyage.

Norman R-W was still drinking and thus became the first English alcoholic to attend an AA meeting drunk.

The second meeting was held in the tea room of the Dominion Theatre, Tottenham Court Road.


Present – Canadian Bob, Tony F and Norman R-W


February 1948

Marty M visits – and "performed a miracle when she was here and we invited many doctors"




#### Autumn 1948

He visited Lottie in London and Scottish inquiries were referred to him. Forbes C got involved and Marty M. visited and gave crucial advice.



#### 1950 - Bill W visits




- June 1950 Bill and Lois visit.

Present – David Y, Norman M,


Archie P, Rex and Sackville

**Rex** produced the first issue of a Welsh local newsletter in December 1951 called '*Iechyd Da*' ('Good Health')


**Archie** later moved to London and became editor of the Central Office Newsletter
