How to write a cover letter

A well-written cover letter is your opportunity to introduce yourself, explain why you're a strong candidate, and showcase your enthusiasm for the role. A statement of purpose or a motivational statement is the same thing but without the letter format. You usually write a personal statement for college applications. You can be creative with things like personal statements because they are more like essays. Whereas a cover letter is a bit more professional and formal but you can still be creative with it.

1. Start with the Header

At the top of the page, include your contact information and the recipient's details:

2. Greet the manager

If possible, address the recipient by name. If you're unsure, use a professional greeting like:

- "Dear [Hiring Manager's Name]"
- "Dear Sir/Madam

3. Write an Engaging Opening Paragraph

• Briefly state your enthusiasm and what makes you a strong candidate. Example:

I am excited to apply for the [Position Title] role at [Company Name]. With my background in [.....], I am confident in my ability to contribute to your team.

4. Highlight Your Skills and Achievements

In 1-2 paragraphs, connect your experience to the job requirements. Use specific examples to demonstrate your qualifications. Focus on results and impact.

- Mention relevant accomplishments from your work, volunteering, or academic experiences.
- Use statistics where possible (e.g., "led a team of 10 volunteers").

Example:

In my role as [...... I managed [specific task], resulting in [.........]. Additionally, I developed [skills] by [specific action]. These experiences have prepared me to handle [responsibilities related to the current job description] with efficiency and innovation.

5. Explain Why You Want to Work for the Company

Show that you've researched the organization and align your goals with theirs. This demonstrates genuine interest.

6. End on a confident and positive note.

- Reiterate your enthusiasm for the role.
- Express willingness to discuss your application further or attend an interview.
