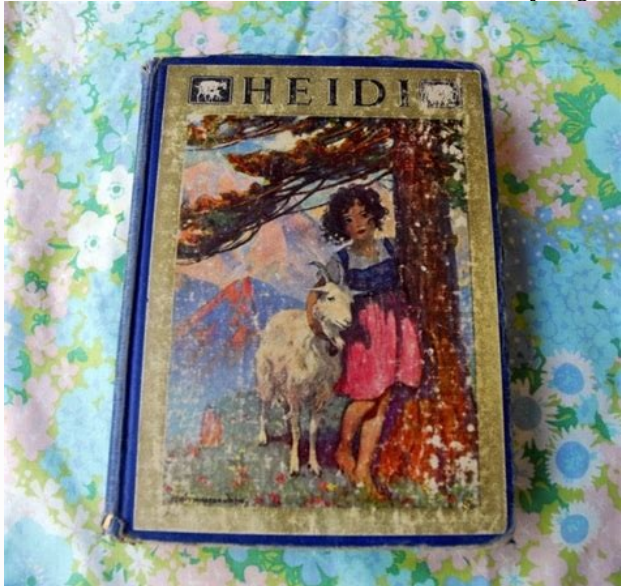

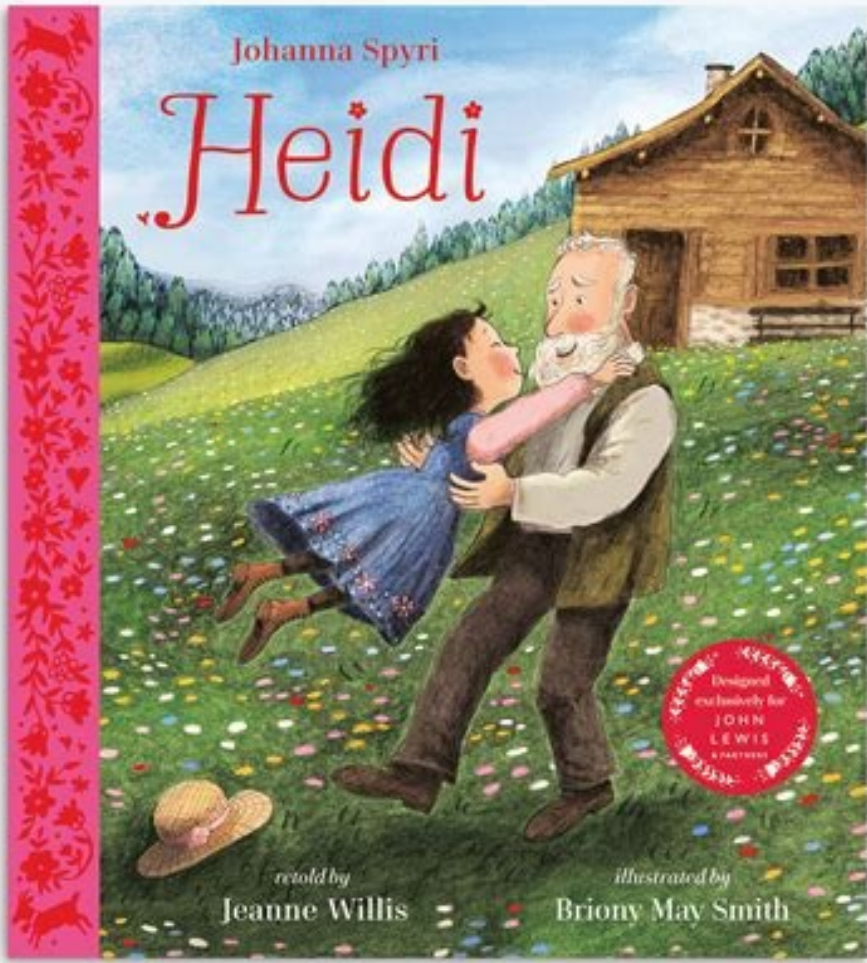
When Marta has still not returned home by nightfall, everyone is getting worried. How do I get involved in the Guardian children's books site?

As the strawberries blossom, Heidi gives birth to not just one child, but twins - a boy and girl that are named Tobias and Marta, at the grandfather's suggestion. Heidi was written over 130 years ago, but children can relate to her story today just as easily as they did when the book was first written. On their return to the chalet, they discover that Martali is missing. Heidi gives her a small package that has been left for her by the Uncle, but when Marta opens it, the package is empty. Heidi's grandfather is a cold-hearted and mean man at the beginning. Heidi makes a good playmate and friend to Clara, but she can't get over her homesickness and longs for the mountains where everything is green and fresh. Her friend from school, Jeanne-Marie (Jamy) is still teaching at the local school and living with them in the doctor's house in Dorfli. Unfortunately, this plan backfires completely. Instead of making Clara feel isolated, he makes her realise she can walk!This is one of those classic books that I would highly recommend to anyone. Surprisingly, Heidi's grandfather turns out to be welcoming and loving and lets Heidi stay in his mountain home, which she adores.The part of the book I enjoyed most is when Heidi makes a new friend called Clara. I loved the part when Heidi saved up all her soft, white rolls for Grandma so that she wouldn't have to chew the hard bread or when the housekeeper screamed after seeing the basketful of kittens which Heidi had rescued from the top of the clock tower. The Uncle is furious and angrily tells Marta she is just like her grandmother, obsessed with money.



The Uncle is getting older and begins to fade. But she was used to fine things and a rich lifestyle that he could not maintain. When Clara came, everything changed for Peter who became jealous because he felt that he was not getting Heidi's complete attention. She is afraid of the stern Alm-Uncle but slowly grows to love him as he helps her with her studies. After hours of searching the mountainside, she takes refuge under Rainy Day Rock where she finds Martali asleep. Heidi had been previously living with her Aunt Dete, but now Dete has been appointed to a job in Frankfurt. He was an Austrian soldier who met and married Jamy and Marta's grandmother. While everyone is welcoming Marta's parents, the children make a discovery in the garden. This man is her grandfather. Jamy goes with her parents to Vaud where she marries Max, a local geologist she met through them. She constantly fears that the hand will reach down once more and snatch away those she loves. She tells Marta the Uncle's story and she finally understands. He tells Marta to bite the coin and see if it tastes as sweet as the berries. However, as they get to know each other, the love between Heidi and her grandfather grows so strong they cannot be separated. A letter from Jamy's younger sister, Marta, prompts her to ask Heidi if the young girl can stay with them. There is no way she is going to turn down this job to look after Heidi; she has to go. The grandfather's story unfolds. Clara is determined to walk again, but will she? In trying to calm her, Marta has a realisation of how difficult she must have been for her mother to deal with, and it leads her to decide to go and stay with her parents for the summer. The older son - Heidi's father - stayed with the Uncle. Marta is terrified they have come to take her home. Also, the descriptive language about the Swiss Alps really inspired me to visit the land of Heidi and perhaps see those mountain goats for myself... maybe one day! Peter knows this, so he decides to get rid of the chair; that way, he will be able to spend more time with Heidi. Marta learns many lessons while in Dorfli. Not so with this book.The story is about an orphan girl, Heidi, who has been sent to live with a lonely, angry man at the top of a mountain in the Swiss Alps. They move up to the chalet on the Alm over the summer where Peter sets up a cheese factory. The relationship between Heidi and her grandfather was undoubtedly strong, while the relationship between Heidi and Peter was strong too until Clara came along. Plot Heidi is happily married to Peter and expecting her first child. Finally, after what seems like forever, Heidi is sent back to the mountains where she belongs.Heidi had told Clara so much about the mountains and one day Clara and her family decide to visit. Things are not improved by a visit from Marta and Jamy's parents. They find half of a gold cross that is the other half to a locket that was handed down from Marta's grandmother. He did everything he could to make his wife happy, but she left him and went home to her parents, taking their baby son - Jamy and Marta's father - with her. Heidi has to travel very far to Frankfurt where Clara lives, and is dismayed by the grey, dreary and gloomy streets. A fearful, timid child, Marta struggles to fit into the simple Swiss peasant lifestyle. But Marta is still not happy. While visiting, Clara's wheelchair mysteriously disappears. Heidi tells her to copy the others, as she was worried she would not know what to do. She turns up happily some time later, having gone down to Maienfield with the others to sell her berries. Despite the growing darkness, Marta sets out to find the little girl. Heidi and Jamy are delighted to discover they are cousins and the reunited family celebrates, although Marta does not understand. Her parents are struggling to cope with her emotional outbursts, which have increased in frequency and severity since the death of Marta and Jamy's grandmother, and Jamy feels that if anyone can help her, it will be Heidi. The Uncle sadly dies not long after this. Clara's stranded in a wheelchair and cannot travel anywhere without it. Spyri writes about relationships and feelings between the characters, which we all experience.
